This month we are shining the spotlight on another helpful resource!

Mental Health and Addiction Support in Nova Scotia is a phone call away!

The Mental Health and Addictions Provincial Intake Line is here for you. This free, confidential service is the first step toward feeling better. Services are available for all ages.

If any of these feelings sound familiar, reaching out can make a difference:

- Ongoing stress, burnout, or emotional fatigue
 - Grief or loss that feels too heavy to carry
 - Worries that won't go away
- Feelings of depression, anxiety, or being overwhelmed
 - Substance use you're concerned about
 - Experiencing a crisis or major life change
- Help sorting out what kind of support you may need
 - Concern for yourself or others

What to Expect

- A call back from a trained intake clinician who will speak with you for approximately 30 minutes to better understand you and your mental health needs.
- Be matched with the best treatment options available including virtual and in-person options and free community resources closest to you.
 - Wait times vary. Urgent appointment offered within 7 days. Priority needs are seen within 28 days.

No doctor's referral needed! Speak directly with an intake clinician who will listen without judgment and guide you toward the help that fits your needs.
